MENTORSHIP TOPICS

Topic 1: The importance of the mentor/mentee relationship

The course will provide information about the roles and responsibilities of mentors and mentees. Topics covered will include the different types of mentoring, identifying and creating a mentor network, relationship building, conflict management, and mentoring of different audiences. This course is especially important for young professionals wanting to understand how to succeed in their careers through professional, social, and mental balance.

Topic 2: Shared expectations and mentoring

The course will provide information about how to optimize the mentor/mentee relationship through a shared expectations approach. Participants will develop their own shared expectations guidelines to use with mentors/mentees. Cultural and gender differences will also be explored.
