As Head of the Regulatory Acts and Prospective Unit at Cameroon's Radiological Safety and Nuclear Security Authority (ASRAN), she leads the development, implementation, and monitoring of national laws and standards for radiation protection and nuclear safety. Adeline's expertise spans regulatory compliance, capacity building, and incident management, including the design of internal knowledge transfer programs and the training of frontline workers in both medical and industrial sectors. Her hands-on experience includes conducting radiation protection inspections, implementing security measures for the transport of radioactive sources, and overseeing nuclear security for major public events.

Internationally, Adeline is recognized for her leadership in professional associations: she is founder and president of Women in Nuclear Cameroon, co-founder and secretary of the Institute of Nuclear Material Management (INMM) Africa Chapter, and serves as Advisor for WiN Global Young Generation and Parentaly Project Manager.
